SUMMER SESSION — JUNE 15 to SEPTEMBER 15, 1940



Qualified applicants who act promptly may begin training in aeronautics now with government aid — Twenty-two students taught to fly in term now closing.

Staff of licensed experts — Airport adjoining college campus handles American Airlines passenger traffic — equipped with meteorological and radio beam stations.

Government controlled course includes 72 hours ground school in theory and 35 to 50 hours flight instruction — Airplanes, tuition, insurance, textbooks, and equipment provided free.

Living expenses on campus \$5.00 per week, payable 4 weeks in advance.

Requirements — U. S. citizenship; age limits 18 to 25 inclusive; parental consent if under 21; must pass physical examination for commercial CPT grade student pilots certificate; adequate finances for living expenses. Preference given to college students and graduates.
