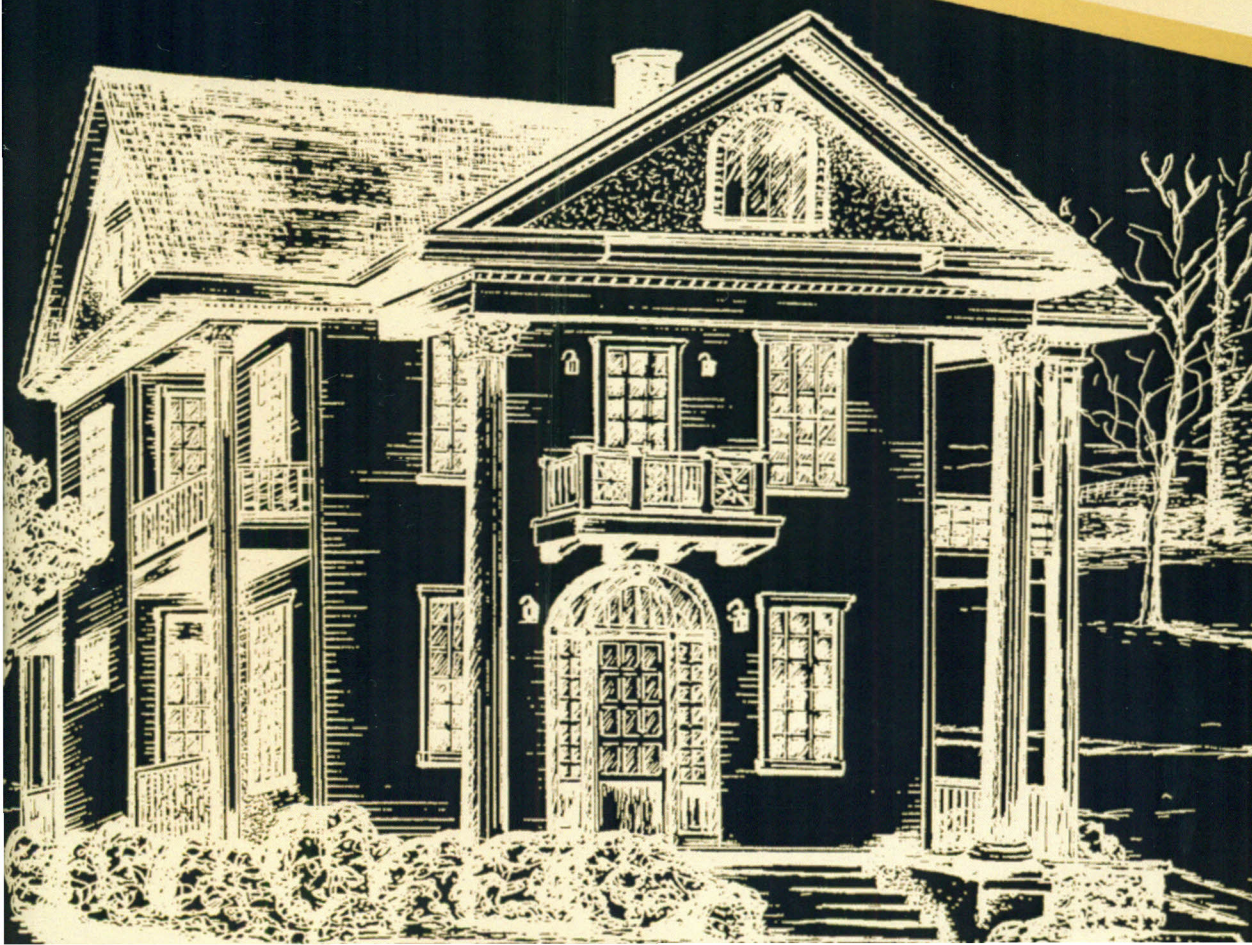

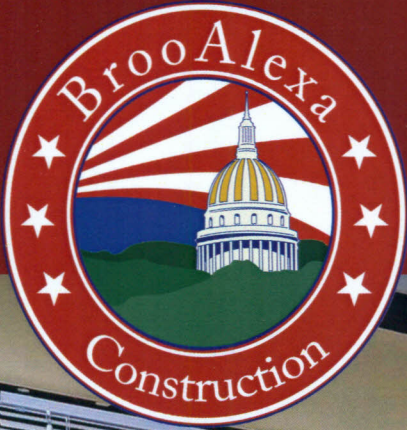

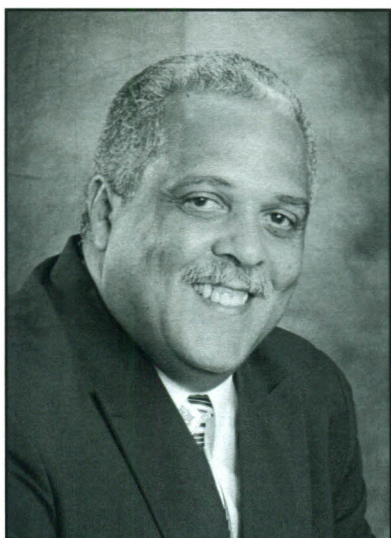

A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC, was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on October 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes.

A special note of thanks to President Emeritus Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

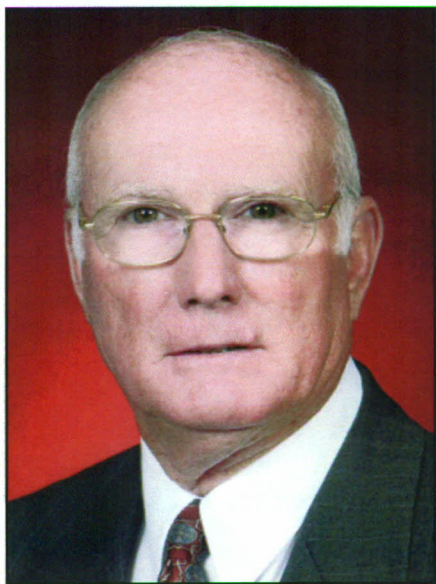

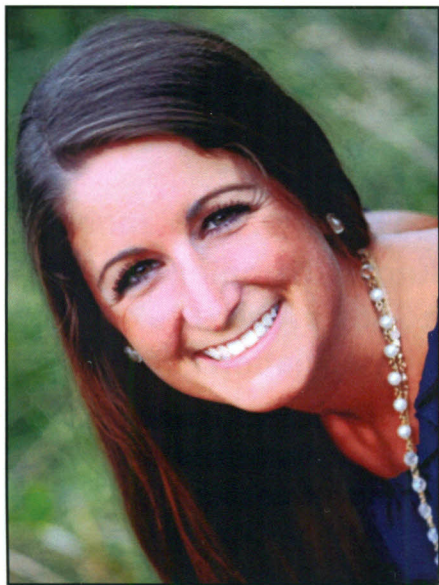
Richard L. (Dick) Dunlap was born on August 2, 1941 in Dunbar, WV to Richard H. and Thelma Dunlap. He graduated from Dunbar High School 1959 where he participated in football and was a member of 3 State Championship Track teams.

Dick graduated from "State" in 1965 with a B.S. Degree in Health & Physical Education and Social Studies. He went on to teach at South Charleston High School and was Head Track & Field Coach for 16 years as well as coaching football, basketball and cross country. After earning his M.S. Degree and Administrative Certificate, he served as Assistant Principal at Dunbar Junior High School until his retirement in 1997.

For the last 17 years Dick has continued his passion for track by being a volunteer hurdle coach for Winfield High School's Track & Field teams. He has played a significant role in 7 Boys' State Championship teams, 6 Girls' State Championship teams, had 15 individual state champions and 7 shuttle hurdle relay championships, where currently 2 state hurdle records are held. According to milesplit.com, in 2011 the Winfield High School Boys' 110 Meter Shuttle Hurdle Relay team had the best time in the United States. Dick has also been a volunteer coach for 12 years at the University of South Carolina's Track Camps, under the leadership of Olympic Assistant Coach, Curtis Frye.

In addition to having a "one track mind", Dick enjoys farming and spending time with his friends and family. He has been married to his high school sweetheart Joanna for 52 years, who also graduated from "State" in 1969.

Taryn Haas is the daughter of Doug and Kory Ute and Ed Haas. She came to "State" from Prospect, Ohio after graduating from Elgin High School. She not only excelled academically but, was also a three-time All-Ohioan in volleyball.

While at "State", Taryn was a four year starter and team captain, set multiple game, match and career records. She ranks first all-time in assists (5,104), serve percentage (96.8%), service attempts (449), sets played (444) and matches played (136). Additionally she holds single season records in assists (1,626), assists per set (12.7), service attempts (305), sets played (128) and matches played (38).

Taryn's individual honors continued when she was named WVIAC Player of the Year in 2005 and the WVIAC Tournament's Most Valuable Player in 2006. She helped lead the volleyball team to the WVIAC Season and Tournament Championships as well as "State's" first NCAA Tournament berth in 2006.

Not only did Taryn excel on the volleyball court, she maintained a 4.0 grade point average and received the "W" Club Outstanding Scholar Athlete for 4 straight years. She graduated Summa Cum Laude in 2007 with a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education and continued her studies at Ohio State University, earning her Master's Degree in Educational Administration in 2011.

Taryn is currently in her seventh year of teaching 2nd grade in the Jonathan Alder School District. After coaching high school volleyball for 3 years, Taryn is now in her third year as Head Volleyball Coach at Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, Ohio.

Ms. Taryn Haas enjoys spending time with family and friends and maintains a close relationship with her Yellow Jacket teammates and coaches. She especially loves her yearly trips back to "State" for Homecoming and diligently follows WVSU volleyball. Taryn is looking forward to marrying Cory Fuller in June 2014 and they will reside in Ostrander, Ohio.

Shawn Harvey was born December 31, 1973 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to Anthony Coleman and Brenda Harvey. He graduated from West Philadelphia High School 1991 and then enrolled in Essex County College before transferring to "State" in 1992, at the request of Head Basketball Coach Robert Marshall.

Through continuous hard work Shawn scored double figures in 75 out of 78 games and led the conference in scoring and rebounding in 1996. He averaged 27.6 points per game and 10.1 rebounds per game that year. Shawn holds one of the all time leading scoring averages and total career points to this day at "State". In addition to basketball, he was also Track All-Conference in the 200 meters and 4x400 relay.

After leaving "State", Shawn was drafted by the Dallas Mavericks as the 34th pick in the 1996 NBA Draft. He was fortunate to have played professional basketball in the Continental Basketball Association, France, Italy, Philippines and Australia.

Shawn has 2 sons, Trevond and Shawn Jr. and lives in Philadelphia with his soon to be wife, Maureen and his 2 dogs. He continues to give back to his community by coaching and mentoring inner-city boys and works as a Recreational Therapist for adjudicated youth.

Hen was team captain for the 1980 "State" football team. In 1977, he was named most valuable defensive lineman and then again in 1979 and 1980. Continuing to excel in football, Hen was also player of the week in October of 1979 and 1980 as well as, "State's" Homecoming most valuable player. He was a member of the 1979 Southern Conference Championship team. As a senior, Hen averaged 10 tackles a game making him a valuable member of the team.

In 1982 Hen was a member of the West Virginia Rockets football team as starting nose guard. After graduating from "State" with a B. S. Degree in Social Work, Hen enlisted in the U. S. Army and after 21 years, Hen retired. He received numerous awards for his dedication to serving his country.

As a disabled veteran, Hen's passion is weight lifting. He has 2 children, Shawn and Jamie. He currently resides in Clayton, North Carolina.

James Hill. Jr. "Butch" was born on January 17, 1938 in Institute, West Virginia. He was one of a few students who attended elementary, high school, college and graduate school, all on the campus of WVSC (University).

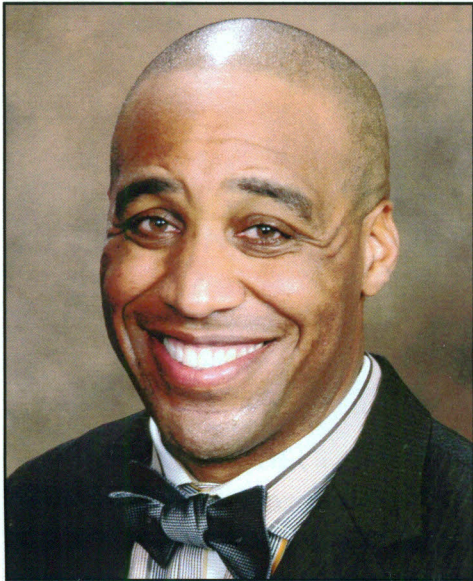
Butch entered "State" in the summer of 1957 and joined the swim team that same year. He excelled as a free style sprinter and diver. The "State" Swim team won their first meet in six years in 1957. In that first winning swim meet, Butch was the high point scorer earning him first place in the four by 100 yard free style relay and second place in 50 yard free style sprint. He continued to score in every meet the swim team competed in during his time at "State".

Butch served 2 years in the U. S. Army as a Medical Corpsman. After graduating, Butch served as the Tutorial Supervisor for the Special Services Program at "State". During that time he became the First Commander of the initial American Legion Post organized on a college campus. The majority of his working career was with E. I Du Pont De Nemours; where he was employed as a State and Federal Regulatory Specialist for EPA. While at Du Pont, Butch was responsible for implementing a program that provided a fair and impartial environment for individuals to be promoted into supervisory positions.

After retirement from Du Pont, Butch was employed as the State Recycling Coordinator for the WV Division of Natural Resources. During his tenure with the DNR, Butch was elected to 2 terms as the President of the Mid Atlantic Consortium of Recycling and Economic Development Officials.

As part of his civic responsibilities, he has served for 15 years as a member of the Salvation Army Advisory Board and is presently a proud member.

Julius A. McLeod II (known as "Juice"), was born in Gallipolis, Ohio to Julius and Betty McLeod. He and his family moved to Institute, West Virginia in 1972 and he graduated from Dunbar High School in 1984. While in high school, Julius received numerous awards for his gallant efforts on the football field. He received a scholarship to Norfolk State University in 1984. He later returned to "State" and lettered three years in football. "Juice" was selected All-WVIAC First Team Offense Wide Receiver in 1987. He also received an ROTC scholarship while at "State" and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in May of 1988. His military education includes: Airborne Course, Transportation Officer Basic Course, Logistics Captain Career Course, Combined Arms and Service Staff School, Logistics Executive Course and Intermediate Level Education.

In March of 2009, Julius was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and is currently assigned to 79 Sustainment Support Command, Deputy G4 of Logistics in Los Alamitos, California. He serves as the senior military advisor on all Logistics within the command, being responsible for planning, coordinates and monitors logistic efforts which include maintenance, supply, food service, contracting, and transportation to provide efficient organizational support for 22,000 soldiers in the command. Al Vance was born in Holden, West Virginia on June 22, 1953 and is the third son of four boys of Kelso and Rosie Vance. He graduated from Logan High School 1971 where he excelled in basketball and baseball. Al was the second leading scorer in basketball and leading hitter on the baseball team.

The late great Coach Chester Burris recruited Al to play basketball at "State". He led the team in scoring and steals, was second in assists in 1972 and 1973. Al was blessed to have played with an outstanding team who lost in the final game of the regular season at Fairmont 64-62 that decided the number one team in the WVIAC. "State" was ranked nationally in 1973 going undefeated at home while finishing the season with 21 wins and 11 losses (16-5 record in the WVIAC).

Al graduated from "State" with a 3.0 grade point average and earned his B.S. in Agricultural Technology in 1975. After 37 years of service, Al retired from Union Carbide and Dow Chemical Company in 2011. He served on two National Fire Protection Association standard technical writing committees and assisted in the development of fire safety codes to help protect people, property and the environment.

Al and his wife Margretta (Hogue) reside in Missouri City, Texas. They were blessed with two children, Kimberly and Greg (Alfred II). His greatest joy is watching his grandchildren, Jordan and Kennedy play sports and being an active member of the Fort Bend Church.

JUDGE REGGIE B. WALTON **Honorary Inductee** **Class of 1971**

Lettered 3 years in Football
1968 Nationally Ranked Conference Champions

Reggie B. Walton was born in Donora, Pennsylvania on February 8, 1949. While attending "State", he lettered 3 years in football and played on the 1968 nationally ranked conference championship team. Reggie helped lead his team that year to an 8-1 season, 5-1 in the conference. During his senior year at "State" he served as the Chief Justice of the Student Court. After graduating in 1971, Reggie went on to receive his Juris Doctorate from the American University, Washington College of Law in 1974. Judge Walton assumed his current position as a U.S. District Judge for the District of Columbia in 2001. He was appointed by President George W. Bush in 2004 to chair the National Prison Rape Elimination Commission, which was created by Congress to identify methods to curb incidents of prison rapes. The U.S. Attorney General adopted the Commission's recommendations for implementation in federal prisons; other federal, state and local officials throughout the country are considering adopting the recommendations. Former U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice William Rehnquist appointed Judge Walton to the federal judiciary's Criminal Law Committee in 2005, which he served on until 2011. In 2007, Chief Justice John Roberts appointed Judge Walton to a 7-year term as a Judge of the U.S. Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court and subsequently he was appointed Presiding Judge in 2013. From 1981-1989 and 1991-2001, Judge Walton served as an Associate Judge of the Superior Court of the District of Columbia. From 1989-1991, he also served as President Bush's Associate Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy in the Executive Office of the President as well as, Senior White House Advisor for Crime. Judge Walton has served as the Executive Assistant U.S Attorney, Assistant U.S. Attorney and Chief of the Office's Career Criminal Unit.

Judge Reggie Walton has been the recipient of dozens of local, national and international honors and awards. He has presided over notable trials, including those of "Scooter" Libby and Roger Clemens. A book titled "Black Judges on Justice: Perspectives from the Bench", profiled 14 judges, which included Judge Walton. It was the first effort to assess the judicial perspectives of prominent African-American judges. Not only is Judge Reggie Walton an instructor in Harvard Law School's Advocacy Workshop and a faculty member at the National Judicial College in Nevada, he remains active in working with young people around the country and D.C area. Judge Walton continues to speak at schools, where he emphasizes the importance of personal responsibility and the perils of drugs and crime.

Judge Reggie B. Walton and his wife are the parents of one daughter.
