1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Governor William W. Lipscomb called the meeting of the Institutional Advancement Committee to order at 10:31 a.m.

Administrative Clerk (Maria Drake) called the roll.

2. Verification of Appropriate Notice of Public Meeting

Governor Lipscomb announced verification of the appropriate notice of the meeting.

3. Review and Approval of Agenda

Committee members requested amendments to the agenda. First, remove Nate Burton from item #6 since he is not available to report. Second, change University Advancement, Communications & Marketing to item #5, and Next Meeting Date to item #6. Governor Kelley moved approval of the amended agenda; the motion was seconded by Governor Gray; motion carried.

4. Review and Approval of Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Governor Smith moved approval of the May 10, 2019, meeting minutes; the motion was seconded by Governor Kelley; motion carried.

5. Reports from University Advancement, Communications & Marketing A. Fundraising Updates

I. Vice President Schumann presented the Comparative Gift Report. As of May 28, 2019, we had received \$1,318,780 in new gifts and pledges this fiscal year. This is 32% higher than the same date last year. The number of donors (966) was slightly lower than the same date last year. The \$440,000 commitment from the Thurgood Marshall College Fund Center for Advancing Opportunity should be formalized and officially recorded next week, bringing the total to \$1,758,000. There are several major gifts that could potentially be closed before the end of the fiscal year, and we are receiving responses to our final direct mail appeal of the year. The appeal emphasizes the Presidential Scholarship fund. We are getting closer to the President's \$400,000 challenge; the current total is \$325,000. The Advancement Staff will hold a retreat on June 20-21 to set goals and plan for the next two years of the Strategic Fundraising Plan. We will also be reviewing an analysis of our giving trends over the past 10 years. This information will inform our planning for the next

two years. The WVSU Foundation Board of Directors will hold a retreat on August 23.

B. Alumni Relations

I. Summer Alumni Events

Director of Alumni Relations Belinda Fuller presented an updated calendar of events. Alumni Relations is active with a series of chapter events around the country this summer. University representatives will be traveling to Charlotte, NC for the Charlotte Chapter's annual picnic. On the same weekend, the Philadelphia Chapter will have a picnic. On June 22, the YWCA Charleston's Over the Edge, Rappel for a Reason fundraiser will be held, and we will have some university administrators participating. Alumni Relations will have a tent at this event, and President Jenkins and Dr. Ulises Toledo, Associate Vice President for Research and Public Service Administration, will be rappelling down the BB&T Bank building in downtown Charleston. The Raleigh-Durham Chapter will hold its annual event at Durham Bulls Park on June 15. The Atlanta and Washington Metro chapters will both be sponsoring 5K races in their cities on June 29. Multifest will be held August 2-3 in Downtown Charleston. We are working diligently on getting enrolled and incoming students involved with chapter events, and encouraging future students to get involved with the chapter in the surrounding area.

II. Homecoming

Mrs. Fuller presented the report for Homecoming 2019. The host hotel will be the Marriott, with surrounding hotels handling the overflow. One of the highlights of the weekend is the dinner cruise on the Belle of Cincinnati. Homecoming information is now available on the alumni website. Online registration will be open on June 17, and the brochure will be mailed in the near future. Individuals must be registered for Homecoming to get a room at the host hotel. We were not able to reserve a block of rooms at Embassy Suites this year because of another event. The Marriott will provide free parking and private breakfast in the Pavilion for WVSU hotel guests. Mrs. Fuller highlighted two new features at Homecoming, a wine tasting and a cigar bar at the young alumni mixer. The cigar bar will be in a tent outside Erickson Alumni Center.

Governor Charles E. Jones, Jr. called the meeting of the Institutional Advancement Committee to order at 8:35 a.m.

A quorum was not met; no action of the Committee was taken.

2. Verification of Appropriate Notice of Public Meeting

Governor Jones announced verification of appropriate notice of the meeting.

3. Report from Athletics Director Nate Burton

Mr. Nate Burton, Athletics Director, provided an Athletics Report updating the Committee on the 2018-19 Advancement Report for Fiscal Year (FY) 19. Intercollegiate Athletics raised \$430,000, totaling \$1.4 million over the past 3 years. The average for a Division II program within the Mountain East Conference is \$200,000 each year. Athletics is exceeding fundraising totals within the Conference.

The FY20 goal is \$400,000. Currently, Athletics is focused on sponsorships, particularly for its Men's and Women's basketball teams. Athletics will continue to build a cash reserve for items that are not typically budgeted, including future projects, unforeseen concerns with the facilities, opportunities to host tournaments, and expenses associated with post-season competition and championships.

4. Report from University Advancement, Communications & Marketing

A. Fundraising Updates

Ms. Patricia Schumann, Vice President for University Advancement, introduced the Annual Fundraising Report. The FY19 fundraising goal was not met. From an analysis of giving trends, there are strategies implemented for broadening the base of support and increasing major and planned gifts.

I. FY2019 Gifts and Projections for FY2020 and FY2021

Ms. Sue Woodward, Assistant Vice President for University Advancement, presented a report of FY2019 Gifts and Projections for FY2020 and FY2021. The analysis of gifts at each level showed an ability to target donors in each group with specific strategies. The focus within this coming year is to increase corporate and foundation support.

II. FY2020 Annual Giving Plan

Ms. Woodward discussed the annual giving plan, which includes mailings and electronic communications throughout the year to cultivate, solicit gifts and effectively steward those who make gifts.

A cultivation postcard was mailed in August to all stakeholders highlighting significant achievements in the past year that were possible because of philanthropic support. A quarterly Foundation Newsletter will highlight gifts and giving opportunities.

The Tower Club, our monthly giving society, has grown by 36% in the past year. Later in September, a launch of "Step Up for STATE" Challenge, includes a "Battle of the Decades," to encourage Alumni participation in giving, and a Friends challenge, authored by new Foundation Board member Chuck Bailey, focusing on community members. The campaign will conclude December 31.

B. Alumni Relations

Homecoming

Ms. Belinda Fuller, Director of Alumni Relations, presented the Homecoming schedule and highlighted items that may be of particular interest to board members. The State of the University Address by President Anthony Jenkins will take place at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 3.

A new event is the Presidential Distinguished Service Award reception on Thursday at 5:30 p.m. Athletics will hold a ceremony Saturday, October 5 at Noon to name Warren Anderson Way. Anderson is the only WVSU athlete drafted to the NFL. A Dinner Cruise is Saturday evening. Dr. Byers is the honored Alumnus of the Year.

In FY2019 Athletics set a new record with \$430,000 raised in support athletic programs and student athletes. Although this is well above the average in the Mountain East Conference, fundraising must continue to grow to support current programs and future progress.

III. Discussion

The report provides an update of funds received during FY2020. With \$93,646.93 raised, the program is off to a strong start. A number of strategies will be employed to reach the FY2020 goal of \$500,000. In addition to raising private support for operations, Athletics will be seeking additional funds to enhance facilities.

II. Background


This new dashboard synthesizes information about revenue, new gift commitments and donors for the first guarter of FY2020 compared with the same period in FY2019.

III. Discussion

The report shows a decline in new pledges for the quarter, but an increase in new outright gifts as well as an increase in gross revenue as compared with the same quarter last year. Gross revenue includes revenue from current commitments as well as payments on pledges made in previous fiscal year. The number of donors is down this year compared with the same period last year, and the percentage of donors who are alumni is also down. These differences are probably due to the significant gift activity in the first quarter of FY2019 leading up to the dedication of the Katherine Johnson statue and scholarship.

II. Background


The post card represented in this report was mailed to 21,000 alumni and friends to kick off the Step Up for STATE/Battle of the Decades Challenge.

2. Verification of Appropriate Notice of Public Meeting

Board of Governor Chair, Mr. Charles E. Jones, Jr. announced the Verification of Appropriate Notice of Public Meeting.

3. Election of Committee Chair

Dr. Ann Brothers Smith recommended to table the election of the Recruitment & Retention committee chair until the next meeting. All members present agreed to table the nomination and election of the committee chair until the October 24, 2019 meeting.

4. Review and Approval of Meeting Agenda

5. Review and Approval of Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Board of Governor Chair, Mr. Charles E. Jones, Jr. requested that the minutes be approved with the correction of the last name spelling of Governor Mark Kelley. Ms. Katherine Dooley made the motion to approve the meeting minutes with the last name spelling correction. Mr. Mark Davis second the motion; motion carried.

6. University Recommendations and Reports

a. Recruitment

Dr. Underdue Murph presented the Office of Undergraduate Admissions Recruitment Packet to all Board Members present. The recruitment packet contained the 2019-2020 View Book, Straight to State Brochures, Office of Financial Aid FAFSA School Code Postcard, ROTC Brochure and a University Pennant. The contents also included the Fall 2019 "Preliminary" Enrollment Report 10th Day Snapshot as of August 30, 2019.

Dr. Underdue Murph stated that our Fall 2020 recruitment season has begun and an initial step was a direct mail campaign of recruitment packets sent to in-state public and private

high school guidance counselors and community college transfer coordinators. Additionally, our new Associate Director of Undergraduate Admissions, Ms. Michelle Hanna was introduced to all present.

Dr. Underdue Murph reported that the Fall 2019 Preliminary 10th Day Snapshot, as of August 30, 2019, for the Undergraduate Headcount increased by 10% compared to Fall 2018, and the Graduate Headcount decreased by 7%. The combined total enrollment increased by 9%. Dr. Underdue Murph also stated that since several graduate classes have yet to begin, we anticipate graduate enrollment to increase. The Fall 2019 Undergraduate Full-Time Equivalency increased by 0.3% compared to Fall 2018, and the Graduate decreased by 11%. The combined Full-Time Equivalency decreased by 0.2%.

Ms. Dooley asked whether we achieved the Fall 2019 undergraduate enrollment goal. Dr. Underdue Murph along with the assistance of Ms. Jameelah Means, Director of Undergraduate Admissions, stated that the Fall 2019 freshman student target goal was 450 and as of the 10th class day snapshot, 280 are enrolled. The target goal for transfer students was 250 and currently 176 are enrolled. At the October 24, 2019 meeting the 30th Day Census enrollment figures will be presented. Dr. Underdue Murph further reiterated, that the industry standard for incremental enrollment growth is based on a 3% projected increase from Fall to Fall.

b. Retention

The First-Time Full-Time Freshman Fall 2018 cohort retention rate indicates that 61% of the students are registered for the Fall 2019 semester as of the 10th Day Snapshot. Whereas, at this point in time last year 55% of the Fall 2017 cohort were registered for the Fall 2018 semester. This indicates a 6% increase for the Fall 2018 cohort compared to Fall 2017.

A new initiative introduced for the Fall 2018 enrollment cycle was the implementation of the merit based Presidential Scholarship to attract and retain new and continuing students. Mr. Kelley asked if whether there were WVSU Foundation Scholarships not awarded due to the stringent eligibility criteria. Dr. Underdue Murph stated that she and Vice President Patricia Schuman had an initial discussion to determine an appropriate approach for donors to revisit their scholarship eligibility criteria.

6. Review and Approval of Minutes of the Previous Meeting

Mr. Davis asked for a motion to approve the meeting minutes from June 6, 2019. Mr. Kelley made a motion, and it was seconded by Dr. Smith. Motion carried.

7. University Recommendations and Reports

a) Monthly Budget Reports - June and July 2019

Mrs. Kristi Williams, Interim Vice President for Business and Finance, addressed the Board and explained the FY19 All Funds Reports as of June 30, 2019. The budgeted target for revenue was 100%, with a total revenue budgeted of \$35,929,104 of which

92.1% of the projected budget was collected at a total of \$33,112,207. A total of \$32,981,630 was spent at 91.8% of the projected amount. Overall \$130,376 more revenue was collected than what was spent for FY19. Auxiliary accounts for FY19 include Athletics, Student Union, Dining Hall, Parking, Faculty Housing, and the Bookstore. The accounts remained flat over July 1 FY18 to June 30 FY19 with an initial fund of \$58,253 and ended with \$58,456.

A total revenue of \$32,112,007 was collected for FY19 which is less than FY18. There was a decrease of the FY19 expenses of \$32,981,630 and \$34,598,298 in FY18 with a net difference of \$395,549. The p-card expenses had an overall increase in FY19 of \$150,000, however payroll is \$19,529,790 which is a decrease of \$518,000 from FY18.

b) Accounts Payable Report

Accounts Payable as of June 30 FY19 has an overall of \$3.275 million. Vendor by Vendor changes from June 30, 2019 compared to June 30, 2018; FY18 consisted of \$2.9 million and FY19 is currently \$3.275 with an overall change of \$369,872. The changes can be attributed to AEP with an increase of \$88,000 and invoices from Learning House summer school sessions were \$276,000. Thompson Hospitality payable has decreased to \$225,000 while ABM has dropped by \$42,000.

c) Accounts Receivable Report

As of June 30 FY19, payables currently has \$403,895 in receivables. In FY18, the balance due was \$514,576, and receivables decreased by \$110,681. The prior year consisted of 938 accounts and is down to 714 accounts.

d) Faculty Housing

As of June 30, 2019, Faculty Housing has an ending cash balance of \$169,122.65. Currently, there is one vacancy with inquiries.

Mr. Kelley motioned to accept the amended agenda. Ms. Dooley seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

4. Review and Approval of Minutes of Previous Meetings

Ms. Dooley motioned for approval of the minutes for the June 6, 2019 meeting. Dr. Smith seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

5. Report from the University President

President Jenkins shared several updates and accomplishments by students, faculty, and staff.

President Jenkins discussed his vision for West Virginia State University to become a premier regional research university that is recognized nationally for its quality education, innovative teaching, and experiential learning. The Criminal Justice online program was recently named the seventh most affordable program in the nation and the highest-ranking among all West Virginia colleges and universities by Best Schools. The University's seven fully online

programs make the University the highest ranked school in the state, further recognizing Interim Provost and Vice President, Dr. R. Charles Byers, the Deans, and faculty; President Jenkins expressed appreciation for all their work carving the niche for quality affordable education. The Education Department is recognized as one of the best teacher education programs in West Virginia. Fred Thomas, Jr., an alumnus, a life-long educator has invested in the Education Department by creating the Fred D. Thomas Learning Center to help prepare future teachers.

Dr. Byers is creating advisory councils for all majors. The councils will consist of experts within the profession to assist with the development of a curriculum to assist students with preparation and transition to career. The University is at a critical point where we must make sure students are receiving hands-on, real-world experiences. Field experiences such as our Education Department and the Teacher in Residence programs are critical in retention and the overall development of our students.

The University is going to examine how to expand experiential learning opportunities, stackable credentials and the importance of developing skills and credentials for success. Career Services is expanding to add its responsibility for ensuring students are prepared and provide followup for students following graduation.

The Research Rookies program, where students are provided with research opportunites has been successful and boasts a retention rate north of 80 percent. The University also working to expand the study abroad program. With an intentional commitment to student success and retention, through the Presidential Scholarship, funds totaling \$112,000 have been awarded to students. Ms. Deja Smoot, a recipient of this prestigious scholarship, was asked to stand to be recognized.

The University is focused on becoming more student-centered, having invested more than \$100,000 in upgrades for the fitness center and the installation of additional security cameras around campus.

The women's soccer team in their inaugural season is now 1-2. The first home game is during Homecoming on Saturday. President Jenkins expressed appreciation to Athletic Director Nate Burton for his work and leadership. Homecoming weekend is the kickoff for the student tailgate for football games. The SGA President, Colleen Miller, is leading the effort to create the tailgate atmosphere for our students. Admission to football games is free to all staff and faculty.

6. Possible Executive Session under the Authority of West Virginia Code §6-9A-4 to Discuss Legal, Personnel and Property Matters

Ms. Dooley motioned for approval to go into Executive Session, under the authority of West Virginia Code §6-9A-4, to discuss legal, personnel and property matters. Dr. Smith seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

A motion to arise from executive session and reconvene into regular session was made by Ms. Dooley, and Dr. Vaughan seconded the motion. The motion carried. Mr. Jones asked for the record to reflect that the Board only discussed items related to the topics listed, that no decisions were made in executive session, and no motions or votes were taken.

7. Other Matters

There was a discussion about changing the April 2 Board meeting. Mr. Kelley motioned to remove the April 2 meeting date of the Board for a prep session for the HLC visit. Mr. Lipscomb seconded the motion, and the motion carried.

Ms. Dooley shared that Board of Governors member General Kenneth Gray is the honoree for the Lunch and Laughs with Legal Legend on September 14th. Ms. Dooley will present a Presidential Citation to General Gray on behalf of President Jenkins.

Higher Learning Commission (HLC)

In order to receive federal support, public post-secondary institutions are required to have accreditation from their regional accreditor:

- WVSU has been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC, formerly the North Central Association)
- HLC is our "US Department of Education gateway."
 Accreditation demonstrates institutional quality,
 rigor, robustness of our curriculum, student support,
 governance, finances.
- Without accreditation, all federal funding is at risk.

HLC GUIDING VALUE

Governance for the well-being of the institution.

"The well-being of an institution requires that its governing board place that well-being above the interests of its own members and the interests of any other entity. Because HLC accredits the educational institution itself, and not the state system, religious organization, corporation, medical center or other entity that may own it, it holds the governing board of an institution accountable for the key aspects of the institution's operations. The governing board must have the independent authority for such accountability and must also hold itself independent of undue influence from individuals, be they donors, elected officials, supporters of athletics, shareholders, or others with personal or political interests.

Governance of a quality institution of higher education will include a significant role for faculty, in particular with regard to currency and sufficiency of the curriculum, expectations for student performance, qualifications of the instructional staff, and adequacy of resources for instructional support."

Role of the Board: Assumed Practices HLC Policy CRRT.B.10.020

Assumed Practices \rightarrow : a set of practices shared by institutions of higher education in the United States. They are (1) generally matters to be determined as <u>facts</u>, rather than matters requiring professional judgment and (2) <u>unlikely to vary</u> by institutional mission or context. <u>hlcommission.or/assumed-practices</u>

Assumed Practices A1, A8, and A9 specifically discuss the governing board of the institution.

A. Integrity: Ethical ad Responsible Conduct

- A1: The institution has a conflict of interest policy that ensures that the governing board and the senior administrative personnel act in the best interest of the institution.
- A8: The governing board and its executive committee, if it has one, include some "public" members. Public members have no significant administrative position or any ownership interest in any of the following: the institution itself; a company that does substantial business with the institution; a company or organization with which the institution has a substantial partnership; a parent, ultimate parent, affiliate, or subsidiary corporation; an investment group or firm substantially involved with one of the above organizations. All publicly-elected members or members appointed by publicly-elected individuals or bodies (governors, elected legislative bodies) are public members.
- A9: The governing board has the authority to approve the annual budget and to engage and dismiss the chief executive officer.

Role of the Board Criteria for Accreditation HLC Policy CRRT.B.10.010

Criteria: the standards of quality by which the HLC determines whether an institution merits accreditation or reaffirmation of accreditation. The Criteria have been designed to seek evidence of continual improvement of the part of member institutions rather to define minimum qualifications.

Role of the Board Criteria for Accreditation HLC Policy CRRT.B.10.010

Criterion 1/Mission: The institution's mission is clear and articulated publicly: it guides the institutions operations.

Core Components:

- 1.A. The institution's mission is broadly understood within the institution and guides its operations.
 - 1. The mission statement is developed through a process suited to the nature and culture of the institution and is adopted by the governing board.

Role of the Board Criteria for Accreditation HLC Policy CRRT.B.10.010

Criterion 2/ Integrity: Ethical and Responsible Conduct: The institution acts with integrity: its conduct is ethical and responsible.

- 2.A The institution operates with integrity in its financial, academic, personnel, and auxiliary functions; it establishes and follows policies and processes for fair and ethical behavior on the part of its governing board, administration, faculty, and staff.
- 2.C The governing board of the institution is sufficiently autonomous to make decisions in the best interest of the institution and to assure its integrity.
 - The governing board's deliberations reflect priorities to preserve and enhance the institution.
 - 2. The governing board reviews and considers the reasonable and relevant interests of the institution's internal and external constituencies during its decision-making deliberations.
 - The governing board preserves its independence from undue influence on the part of donors, elected officials, ownership interests, or other external parties when such influence would not be in the best interest of the institution.
 - 4. The governing board delegates day-to-day management of the institution to the administration and expects the faculty to oversee academic matters.

ROLE OF THE BOARD CRITERIA FOR ACCREDITATION HLC POLICY CRRT.B.10.010

Criterion 5/ Resources, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness: The institution's resources, structures, and processes are sufficient to fulfill its mission, improve the quality of its educational offerings, and respond to future challenges and opportunities. The institution plans for the future.

5.B. The institution's governance and administrative structures promote effective leadership and support collaborative processes that enable the institution to fulfill its mission.

- The governing board is knowledgeable about the institution; it provides oversight of the institution's financial and academic policies and practices and meets its legal and fiduciary responsibilities.
- The institution has and employs policies and procedures to engage its internal constituencies—including its governing board, administration, faculty, staff, and students—in the institution's governance.
- Administration, faculty, staff, and students are involved in setting academic requirements, policy, and processes through effective structures for contribution and collaborative effort.

Board Participation AGB/CHEA Joint Advisory Statement

- The Association of Governing Boards (AGB) and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) suggested practices for governing boards:
 - Establish an accreditation education program
 - Be informed receive, review, and engage on self-study, team report, formal action and decision letters
 - Be informed about accreditation standards that apply to board governance
 - Participate in accreditation process (assuring regular policy review, and WV Code requirements)
 - Assure broad and regular university-wide participation

WVSU BOG Criterion is Met

- 1. The Strategic Planning Process in 2015, the Board reviewed and approved the university mission and vision.
- 2. The Board of Governors is required by WV Code and managed through HEPC, and has established Bylaws for assurance of ethical conduct.
- 5. The Board Bylaws, Committee structure and Meeting actions, at Board meetings for financial health, academic program reviews demonstrate the promotion of effective leadership supportive of collaborative processes that enable the institution to fulfill its mission.

- •Review final self-study report before submission.
- •Meet with visiting team when they come in April 2020.
- •Review draft and final team report.
- •Attend an accrediting commission meeting with CEO and ALO Chicago, every April.
- Receive and review action letters.
- •Require ongoing follow-up reports.
