Ad Hoc University Honors Committee

Report to WVSU Faculty Senate

December 3, 2010

The WVSU Senate appointed a committee of faculty and deans representing the four University Colleges whose charge was to design an Honors Program for WVSU students. Following is a summary of activities and the final recommendation.

Committee Activities

- 1. The committee met every Friday at 10:00, starting with an organizational meeting on October 15 and ending with our final meeting on November 19, 2010. Copies of the meeting notes are available upon request.
- 2. Committee members collected and discussed honors programs from other colleges and universities including Marshall University and Fairmont State University.
- 3. The committee drafted a "purpose" statement to guide them in the creation of the proposed honors program.
- 4. The committee created a survey document to poll the WVSU faculty about their ideas concerning a WVSU Honors program. The committee used this information to inform their decisions regarding the proposed program.
- 5. Purpose statement and Survey Instrument are attached.

Recommendation

Student Criteria

- 1. 3.5 GPA, 26+ composite ACT (with no individual score lower than a 19) for entering students
- 2. 26 college credit hours with a 3.5 GPA for returning students
- 3. 3.5 GPA for transfer students (considered on a case by case basis)
- 4. If an Honors student falls below a 3.31 GPA (in all courses including Honors) then the student must meet with an Honors advisor from the Honors Committee.

Note: Two lists of students would be generated each semester:

- 1. list of returning and transfer students meeting the criteria
- 2. list of admitted high school students with 3.5+ HS GPA with ACT scores

Honors Committee

- 1. Elected representative from each College,
- 2. Four At-Large faculty members elected by the Faculty, and
- 3. One Honors student.
- 4. Ex Officio members: the University Registrar and Admissions Director.


Note: Honors Committee is to work out the details of admission to program whether by invitation or application. Honors Committee decides what courses get on the Honors list of courses.

Honors Program

- 1. Each Department/College will propose existing GE and/or other courses to have honors sections. Any GE Honors courses would replace/count for GE requirement
- 2. Each Honors student will be required to
 - a. Take 15 credits of Honors courses
 - b. Participate in a long-term project of some kind leading to a "capstone" product in the major (to be determined by the department for their majors in the Honors Program with approval by the College Faculty and the College Dean).
 - c. Attend at least two College/University Convocations per semester.

Poll to Gather Faculty Input on an Honors Program for WVSU

A Faculty Senate ad hoc committee began meeting earlier this fall to begin investigation and development of honors opportunities for WVSU students. Our first task was to draft a purpose statement and program objectives. That draft is below. Before we proceed further, we want to gather faculty input on the types of courses and activities to be included, what standards and process would govern admission and retention of students for the program, and what standards and process would govern selection of "honors" courses, and we want to provide an opportunity for faculty members to contribute ideas we might not have considered.

We recognize that this is not a scientific poll. Its purpose is to help guide our future work. Anything we propose will go through further discussion with faculty and will follow normal approval procedures. We appreciate your thoughtful consideration of these issues.

PURPOSE

The honors program at West Virginia State University promotes arrangements, opportunities, and exposures to serve the needs of talented, gifted, and committed students. Its purposes also include identifying and recruiting students of superior academic ability, potential, performance, interest and commitment to accept the designed academic challenges, and to lead West Virginia State University toward even greater excellence.

Objectives

- To create a more vibrant academic environment at West Virginia State University;
- To stimulate creativity and intellectual curiosity through courses, labs, seminars, and forums;
- To enhance students' capacity for independent learning;
- To provide academic opportunities that challenge students to perform at the highest level at which they are capable;
- To symbolize West Virginia State University's commitment to excellence and augment the public image of the University as a place where superior achievement is honored and encouraged;
- To attract scholars and speakers to the campus who might not otherwise be here;
- To increase opportunities for students to associate with students of similar motivations and interests, and to work closely with professors;
- To assist in attracting students of outstanding academic and leadership ability; and
- To assist in attracting and retaining faculty members who are committed to quality education.
