A number of proposals were returned to their departments:

In all cases involving course proposals, it was returned to the department because EPC felt the attached syllabus did not follow the guidelines in the Faculty Handbook. In particular, this usually meant that there were not separate sections for Course Objectives and Student Outcomes.

One proposal from HHPLS was tabled until the January meeting in order for a representative from the department to attend the meeting to discuss the proposal.

Other business:

- In regards to honors courses, EPC feels that the course description should indicate how the honors version differs from the regular version. This could be as simple as an extra sentence "The honors class has added learning objectives associated with extra reading, writing and laboratory assignments" (to quote the proposal for BIO 101H
- Banner somehow needs to show the honor designation for a course in the online schedule, whether as an added field or as part of the prerequisite line.
- Proposals to EPC that need a syllabus must do the syllabus correctly. If in doubt, ask ahead of time.
