Dear Colleagues:

A few weeks ago, our President, Dr. William J. L. Wallace stated in a news release to the Charleston newspapers that West Virginia State College desired to participate in the Federal Scholarship Loan Program. To participate in that program, each college must raise one-tenth of the amount of money requested for loan purposes. West Virginia State College's share was set at \$1,600. That amount would make it possible for us to have a grand total of \$16,000 per year for scholarship loan purposes. In the news release, Dr. Wallace observed that it was highly improbably that the State Board of Education would provide funds for all of the colleges under its jurisdiction to participate in the Federal Loan Program. Further, he stated that such monies would have to be provided by contributions from Alumni groups and friends of the college.

The need for such a loan program is great at West Virginia State College. Several deserving students are forced each semester and each school year to forego educational training because of insufficient funds. That condition may be partially alleviated if our College can participate in the Federal Loan Program. For the benefit of the present generation of students at West Virginia State College, and for generations of students to come, WE MUST PARTICIPATE!

Recently, one of the members of the Sociology Club expressed the view that our Club could make a very worthwhile contribution by donating its excess funds to the President of the College to be utilized for the Federal Scholarship Loan Program. Later discussion extended the idea to all of the Campus organizations in the belief that they, too, would like to participate in such a worthwhile and needy effort. These views were presented formally at our weekly club meeting, and received unanimous approval by the group.

This idea was presented to Dr. Wallace for his reaction and approval. He wholeheartedly endorsed the idea and expressed his delight that such a movement is underway among the students who stand to benefit from the Program. As a result, the Sociology Club has adopted the general philosophy that, "THE LORD HELPS THOSE WHO HELP THEMSELVES." We ask you to share that philosophy through your participation in a concerted student effort to raise a sum of money earmarked to aid in our participation in the Federal Scholarship Loan Program. As a first step, the Sociology Club will devote its next meeting to a discussion by representatives from all Campus organizations of WAYS AND MEANS by which the idea may be implemented. The decision must be a joint one in which all campus organizations participate. The meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 3, 1959, Room 206, Administration Building, at 6:00 P.M.

We urge your organization to send a representative to that meeting. To be successful, each Club must be represented. The time to act is NOW!! This meeting should take precedence over all others. Punctuality is of the essence. We are counting on your representation.

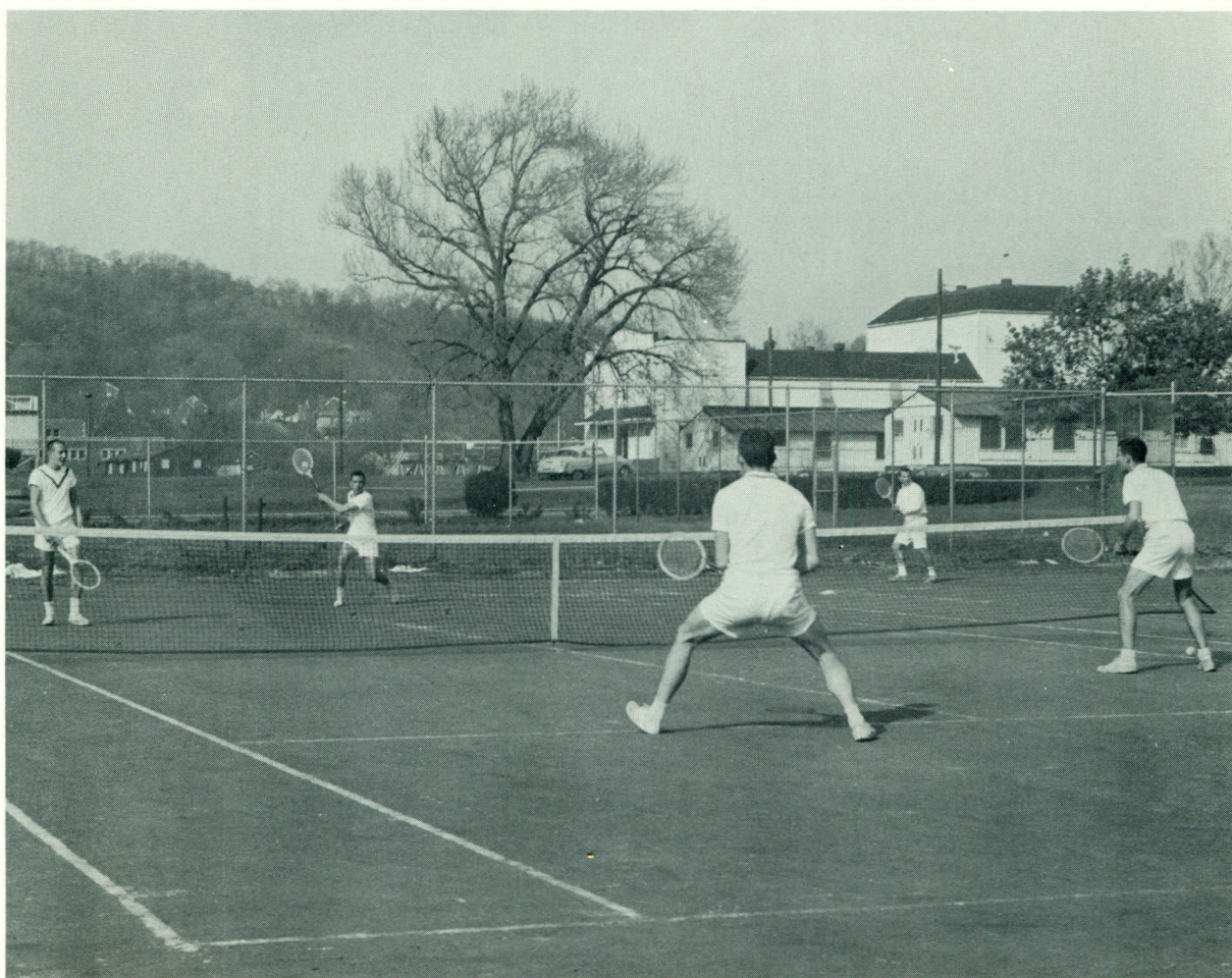
STATE'S MOST SUCCESSFUL BASEBALL SEASON

Their seasonal record was 11 victories with one lone defeat by Central State College by the score 8-4, however the Jackets defeated Central twice 11-3 and 8-5. Their other victories were against Kentucky State College 13-6, 7-6, 13-3 and 8-4. These seven games were non-conference games. The Yellow Jackets were undefeated in W. V. I. A. C. with victories over W. Va. Tech 4-3 (12 innings), and 6-3, Salem College 14-5 and Glenville State College 5-3 and 8-3. Joining the ranks of the champions were the members of the tennis team who won the W. V. I. C. Championship in Wheeling, scoring 15 points.

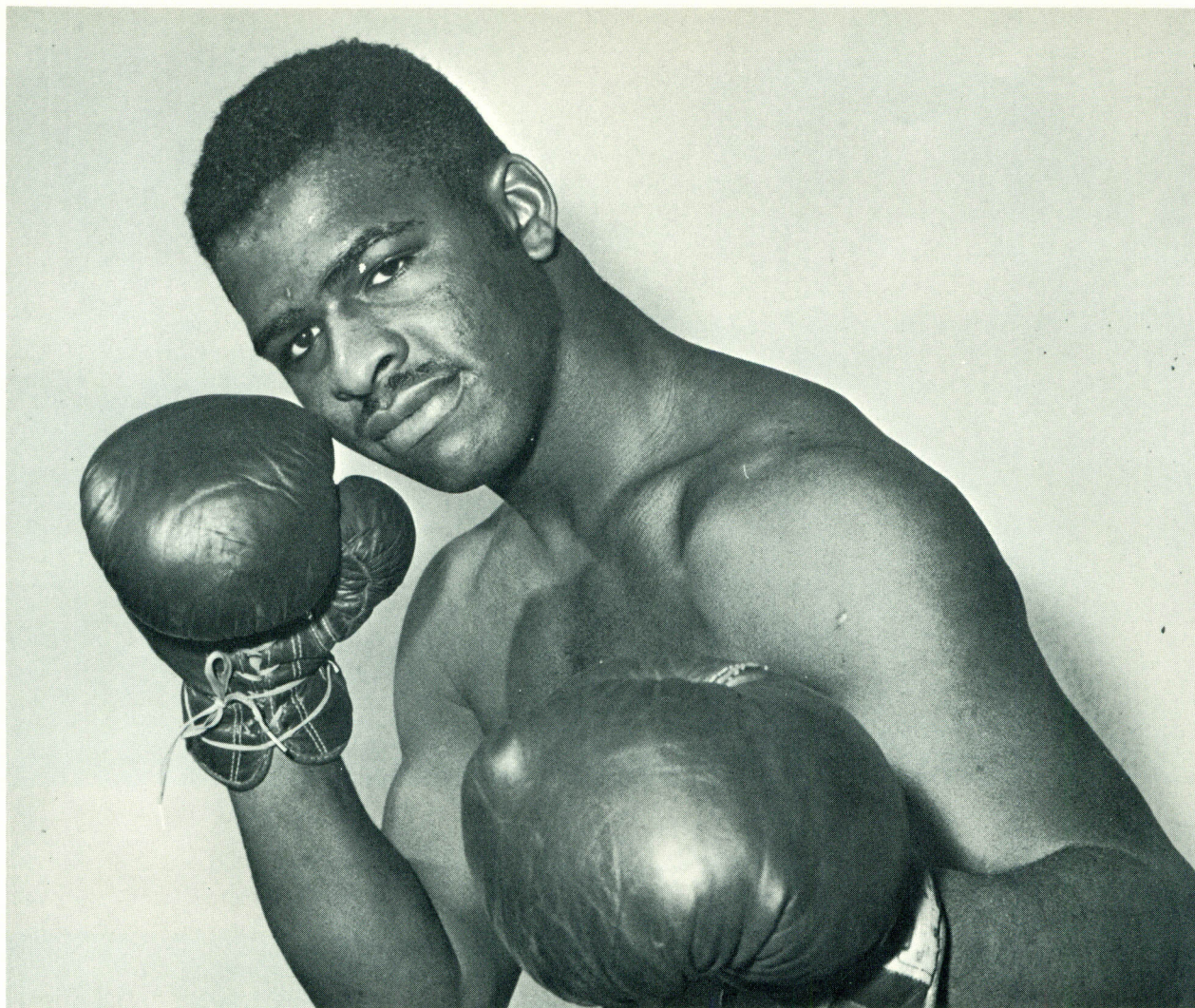

WEST VIRGINIA STATE BOXING CHAMPION

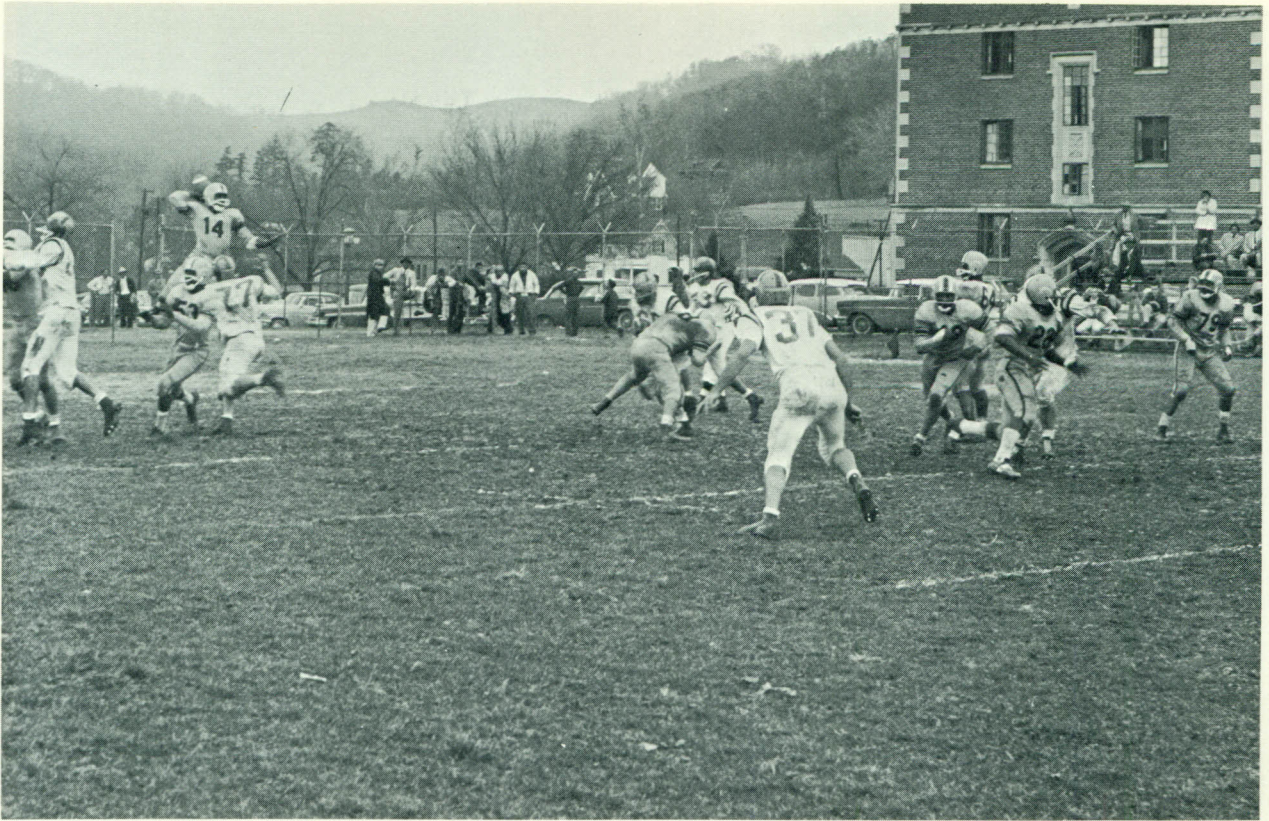

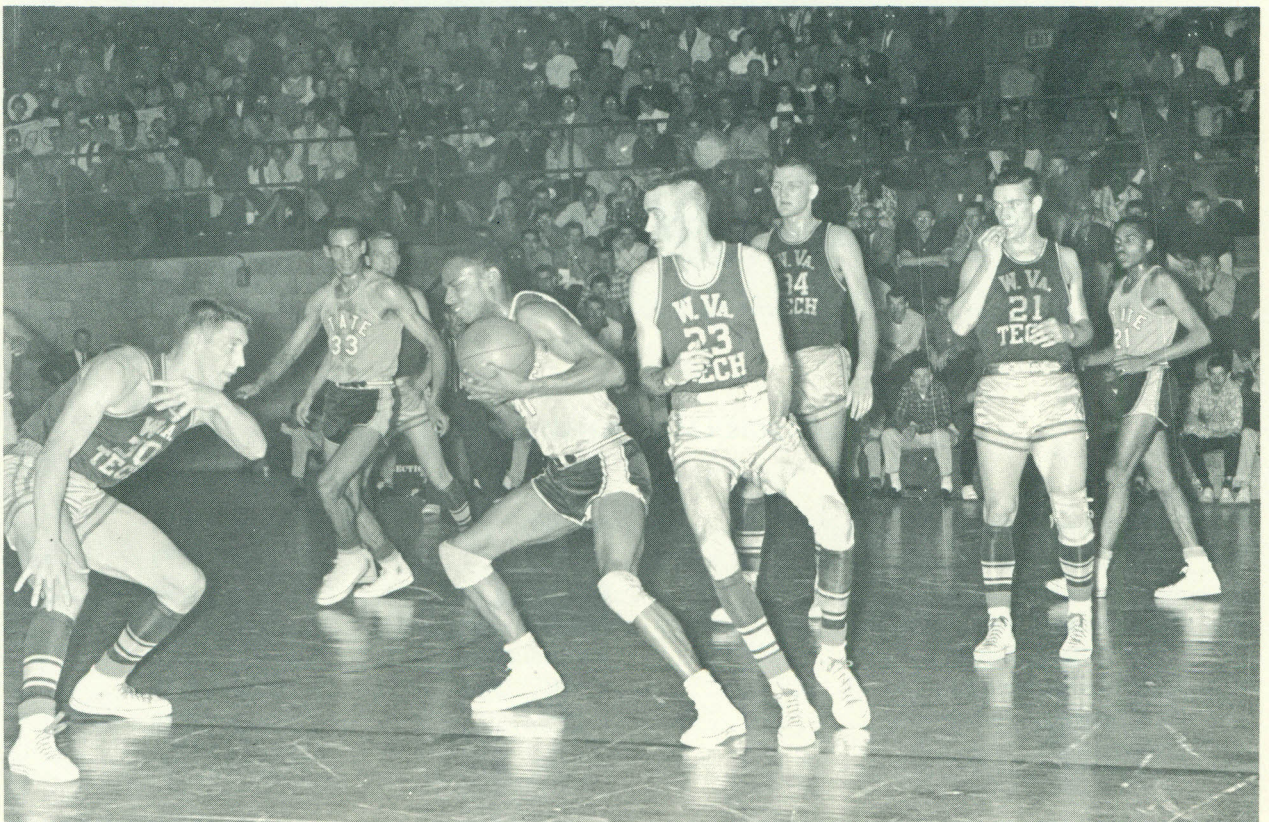


STATE'S CAGERS
