Drive Planned


The Sociology club, coordinating agency for the Student Drive, has announced its plans for the 1960-61 school year. The goal for this year's drive has been set at \$8,000. That amount will enable the college to request \$80,000 from the federal government for scholarship loan purposes. A Student Drive will be conducted in each semester of this academic year. The first has been scheduled for the week of Nov. 4-21, 1960.

The first semester drive will include six major efforts to raise the matching fund. They are as follows: (1) The Give A Buck Campaign; (2) a mammoth bake sale on Nov. 16 in the lobby of the administration building; (3) a first run movie, to be selected; (4) organizational contributions; (5) letters of solicitation to business organizations in the Dunbar, Charleston, Nitro, and St. Albans areas; and (6) an all-college assembly. Most money is expected to be raised through the Give A Buck campaign, in which each student of the college, and friends are requested to give a dollar, as in the preceding years. Solicitors' cards are in preparation by the Printing Department for this purpose. Spirited commuting students are urged to obtain cards authorizing them to solicit funds from their friends in their respective communities.

Letters have been sent to all of the campus organizations and to classes requesting that each include a donation to the Scholarship Drive in their budget. Several organizations have pledged amounts ranging from \$25 to \$150. The Sociology club has already raised a total of \$100 in a raffle conducted during the homecoming game on Oct. 8.

The Sociology club feels that the student body can raise the \$8,000 if the student body cooperates in an all-out effort to do so, Prof. William A. Long, advisor to the Soliology club, has pre dicted success.

Sigma Delta Pi was established on November 14, 1919, at the University of California in Berkeley, long a center of Hispanic studies. Beginning in 1921 chapters in other universities were formed and in 1925, when six chapters were in existence, it became a national honor fraternity. There are now fifty chapters active in the United States.


MARION H. ASHBY

JAMES D. CLEVELAND




CHARLES E. EVANS
