IN MEMORIAM





A quip kept on Coach Price's desk baffled many people. It states:



The purpose of Beta Kappa Chi Scientific Society is to encourage and advance scientific knowledge through original investigation, dissimination of scientific knowledge and stimulation of high scholarship. Each member is required to have completed at least 64 hours with a "B" average or above and 17 semester hours in one of the sciences with an average of at least a "B." Students are required also to present a brief paper on some topic in their field at the time of their initiation. The first national chapter was organized at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania, January 31, 1923. The Beta Kappa Chi Chapter of West Virginia State College was organized on May 8, 1926. 155 members have been inducted into the chapter since that time.

Students on the sophomore level or above who have completed one semester of advanced study in French and have maintained an average in French of 3.00 or "B" and have an accumulative average of 2.80 or "B-" are eligible for membership.


