Professor Adolph P. Hamblin

We, the ARCH staff of 1963, are happy to dedicate this year's annual to a man who is loved and respected by all on West Virginia State's campus, Professor Adolph Putman Hamblin, founder of the Dept. of Biology here at West Virginia State College, and at present he is Chairman of the Dept. of Biological Science, Botany, and Zoology.

Professor Hamblin did his undergraduate work at Knox College of Galesburg, Illinois. He played and earned letters in football, basketball, baseball, and track. He made 13 letters in athletics and earned more athletic awards than any athlete in the history of the school. A few of his awards are: Winner of the Hunter Scholarship Trophy, National Collegiate Football Championship in Negro Colleges, National Negro Intercollegiate Football Champions in 1936, plus a host of others. As of February 15, 1963, he was selected as one of the "Sports Greats" of West Virginia by the West Virginia Centennial Commission.

He did graduate work at Ohio State University in 1946 receiving the Master of Science Degree in Botany.

Professor Hamblin is also a charter member of Theta Psi Chapter of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

We, the SENIOR class of 1963 say: "Farewell." We shall always remember you as a great professor, bestowing radiance of kindness and consideration to all.




We all loved "Juice" in our own particular way and we miss him dearly. Though we are sorry that he is no longer with us, we are happy that he is on God's team.








"An Exciting Year"



They marched down Constitution Avenue in the nation's Capital with other women's groups in an effort to gain suffrage for women. De-emphasizing the social side of sorority life, they demanded high scholastic attainment as a condition for membership and embarked upon an ambitious program of cultural and educational activities. As a result, Delta Sigma Theta is today a public service organization dedicated to a program of sharing membership, skills, and organizational services in the public interest.

HISTORY: Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity was founded on January 5, 1911, at Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana. The Fraternity was incorporated by the State of Indiana on April 15, 1911. Tau Chapter was founded on January 27, 1923, at West Virginia Collegiate Institute (now West Virginia State College) under the direction of W. L. Stewart. The Fraternity was first known as Kappa Alpha Nu. Its name was changed to Kappa Alpha Psi in 1914. Brothers Elder Watson Diggs, John Milton Lee, and Byron K. Armstrong were outstanding in the early development of the Fraternity. The men of Kappa are dedicated to the task of achievement in every field of human endeavor and upholding the standards of brotherhood. The Kappa colors are crimson and cream. The Kappa flower is the trailing arbutus.



Annual Que Capade March of Dimes Project Founders Day Program Annual Oratorical Contest HISTORY: The Omega Psi Phi Fraternity was founded November 17, 1911, at Howard University in Washington, D.C. The founders were three college juniors and a faculty advisor. They were Doctor Oscar J. Cooper of Philadelphia, Reverend Edgar A. Love, Bishop of the A.M.E. Methodist Church, Frank Coleman, and the late Doctor E. E. Just, advisor and Professor of Physics at Howard University.

The founders discovered a large number of capable men willing to help Omega on her way. The next step was to perfect a constitution, for this document was to be submitted to the president of the University, Doctor Wilbur P. Thirkield, for faculty approval.

After many rebukes and adverse decisions, the fraternity finally won approval from the faculty. Having done this the founders sought to expand, being the first Negro fraternity founded at a Negro institution, they planned for the establishment of other chapters. On February 6, 1914, twenty men were initiated into a chapter at Lincoln University, Pa.


