and experiences of its student body.



IN MEMORIAM

The death of Dr. Fannin Saffore Belcher on July 1, 1967, took from West Virginia State College a professor who not only exerted an influence for high academic achievement but one to whom, more than to any other one person, the Department of Drama owes its prestige and stature.

Dr. Belcher was Chairman of the Division of Languages, Literature and Fine Arts. After his graduation from Lincoln University (Pennsylvania), he earned the Master's degree in literature from the University of Pennsylvania and came to West Virginia State College as instructor of literature in the Department of English. Years later the Ph.D. in Drama was conferred upon him by Yale.

The Department of Drama at West Virginia State College is intimately bound up with Fannin S. Belcher. He organized the department and kept high its sights. His skillful leadership and his enthusiasm for intercollegiate drama were responsible for the unforeseen acclaim which came to the West Virginia State College Players.

His clear vision and his influence were not only an inspiration to students at West Virginia State College but added greatly to the increasing emphasis on the international and national educational scene. Dr. Belcher served for two years as visiting Lecturer at the University of Teheran in Iran. Who's Who in American Education and the Dictionary of American Scholars list Dr. Belcher's accomplishments as author, editor, teacher, and administrator. Objective tests for American Classics, designed for use in secondary schools, is one of the most popular works. He received a Rosenwald Fellowship largely as a result of writing the play "Roll You Own," a musical comedy.

During my twenty-one years as Chairman of the English Department I came to know Dr. Belcher well and to appreciate his sound judgment. Although many professors have been part of the history of West Virginia State College, the name of Fannin S. Belcher stands high on the list of those who have made unusual contributions during a significant era in the building of the reputation of the college, both nationally and internationally. His thirty-seven years of achievement and dedication have left an indelible impression upon all who knew him. Dr. Harrison H. Ferrell, Dean of West Virginia State College during the thirty-two years of his association with the college, had this to say: "Dr. Fannin S. Belcher was and will continue to be a brilliant example of excellent teaching."








