

All through the day and into the night the town was filled with the hustle and bustle associated with the neighborhood college. Here the children gathered to learn about the world they would someday enter.








Throughout the course of the year the children elected leaders and queens, attended balls and shared many triumphs and some defeats.

















While helping the new students to adjust to the Charleston area, this group of students took a tour of the Kaufmann's Department Store and many more in the Town Center Mall.














PRILLERMAN HALL




HOMECOMING 1988










