
The Arch is dedicated to Justin, Khalid, and Corinthian. Their memories will live on through their families and friends.

Throughout his career, President Carter has worked



actively with various education, civic and religious organizations. Through his leadership, effective Cluster Programs were established at Norfolk State University, Philander Smith College, and West Virginia State College.

The recipient of numerous awards and honors, Dr.



Ferrell Hall



Erected in 1925 and renovated in 1980, this building was named for Dr. Harrison Ferrell, Academic Dean from 1936-1965. Also known as the Administration Building, this facility houses offices of the President, Vice-President and Director of Fiscal Affairs as well as the main auditorium, and offices for Admissions, Registration, Academic Affairs, and Student Affairs.

Wallace Hall



Erected in 1971, Wallace Hall was named for Dr. William J.L. Wallace, President of the college from 1933 to 1968. Although computer science and mathematics laboratories are located here, it is primarily a classroom building which also houses faculty offices for the Departments of Education, Mathematics, Psychology and Social Work and the Career Services.



Davis Fine Arts Building



This building was erected in 1966 and named for Dr. John W. Davis, President of the college. It is the home of the Fannin S. Belcher Theater (named for a professor of drama, 1930-1967) and the Della Brown Taylor Art Gallery (named for a professor of art, 1960-1986). This facility also accommodates classes, studios and faculty offices for the Department of Art, Communications and Music.

James C. Wilson College Union



Erected in 1961, this facility was named for James C. Wilson, WVSC alumnus and Associate Professor of Physical Education, 1948 to 1967. The "Union" includes the student lounge, game room, bowling lanes, Student Activities and Student Government offices.



Hill Hall



Hill Hall was erected in 1936 and named for John H. Hill, President 1894-1898. Originally erected as a residence hall for women, the building was renovated in 1979. It now houses the Counseling and Tutoring Center, Upward Bound and Special Services as well as faculty offices.



East Hall



Erected in 1895, it was named for its location at the east side of campus. Although it retained its original name, it was later moved to the west side of campus. It has served as boys dormitory, chemistry lab, sewing department. It served as home of five WVSC presidents and has earned its place on the National Registry of Historic Places.

Drain-Jordan Library



Erected in 1951, the Drain-Jordan Library was renovated in 1983. It was named for Leaoned Drain, college librarian, 1927-1956, and for Lawrence Jordan, Professor of Education, 1934-1968.



Fleming Hall



Erected in 1941, this building was named for the governor who had supported the school's establishment, Arthur B. Fleming (1890-1893). It houses the gymnasium, swimming pool, weight room and offices for the Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety.

Hamblin Hall



This science facility was erected in 1952 and named for Adolph Hamblin, professor of biology from 1921-1966. Many laboratory materials collected by Professor Hamblin remain as a reminder of his devotion to West Virginia State College and its students. This building was renovated in 1989.



Thomas W. Cole, Jr., Complex (Community College Building)



This facility, named for WVSC President Thomas Cole, was erected in 1982. It houses offices, classrooms, Educational Network facilities, radio and TV production studios and film lab. It is also the location for offices of Continuing Education and Community Service.



Sullivan Hall



Erected in 1970, this building was named for Dr. Leon H. Sullivan, WVSU alumnus, clergyman, and civil rights leader. It served as residence hall for women as well as administrative offices for the West Virginia College of Graduate Studies.

Prillerman Hall



Erected in 1936 and named for Byrd Prillerman, President of the college, 1901 to 1919, this building has apartments for occupancy by married students and single parents. The Health Center is also located there.

Dawson Hall



Erected in 1918, this building was named for William M. O. Dawson, Governor of West Virginia, 1905-09. This men's residence hall was renovated in 1976.


Gore Hall



Erected in 1927, Gore Hall was also named for a West Virginia Governor, Howard M. Gore (1925-1929). It was occupied as a men's residence hall.

Water Tower

Erected in 1897 and once part of the campus water distribution system, the water tower, WVSC's landmark, no longer functions as a water tower. Lighted at night it is always visible symbolizing the college's mission in "leading youth to acquire vision for service."



Alumni Bell Tower



To symbolize passage of time and preparation for the future, the clock tower and carillon were unveiled. A centennial gift to West Virginia State College from State's National Alumni Association, the \$200,000 structure contained replicas of the college's nine presidents and names of alumni and friends who contributed to construction costs. The tower was erected in 1992.

AΦΑ Fraternity, founded Dec. 4, 1906, at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York, is the first African American Greek letter organization in the world. Alpha Phi Alpha had established ten college chapters on white and black campuses before the founding of any other organization of its kind. A few of its famous members founded the Civil Rights struggle: W.E.B. Dubois - Founder N.A.A.C.P., Fredrick Douglas Patterson - founder United Negro College Fund, Thurgood Marshall - accomplished activist, lawyer and first black Supreme Court Justice, and Martin Luther King, Jr., Civil Rights Activist. Alpha Zeta Chapter at WVSC was founded Dec. 23, 1921.


