






STUDY AIMS FOR HEALTHY FOOD AND WASTE CONTROL

WVSC FORMS PARTNERSHIP WITH EXETER



A tiny organic vegetable garden on the Kanawha River was the result of a multi-faceted partnership between the University of Exeter in England and West Virginia State College. David Stafford, visiting professor from England, conducted a fertilizer study with West Virginia State College biology graduates, Traci Hudson and Shea Hamilton.

The partnership emerged from Stafford's invention of a "digester" — a device to turn chicken manure into healthy, odorless plant fertilizer. In an effort to bring biotechnology to the Kanawha Valley, a previous digester built by Stafford in Hardy County was to be moved to West Virginia State College where it would run on trucked-in chicken manure. The study was geared to grow vegetables in three groups: one with no fertilizer, one with regular chemical fertilizer and one with poultry-

dung fertilizer from the digester.

West Virginia State College's entire biology program was recharged because of the partnership with Exeter. An additional researcher, Jonathan Eya, planned to raise carp on the algae in the water from the digester. Another researcher, David Huber, traveled to Exeter to study soil microbes and tree diseases. Mark Chatfield, WVSC researcher working with Stafford, hoped WVSC would start a master's degree program in environmental biotechnology — which would be the first in West Virginia.

The partnership with Exeter permitted WVSC students to study at Exeter and Exeter professors to teach molecular biology and environmental microbiology at WVSC. Stafford's vision was to use this model for projects in other countries burdened with tons of organic waste.


Libraries Involved in Exchange Program



WVSC received its first grant from the United Negro College Fund to pay for a staff exchange with the National University of Benin in West Africa. The grant, to be paid over three years, was for librarians from the two colleges to change places so each could learn about the other's culture and education techniques. At the end of the three year grant, WVSC would become a depository of Benin government publications. Afterward, scholars wanting to conduct research on Benin would be able to study in West Virginia instead of traveling to Benin.

Genevieve Sohouenou, a librarian with the National University of Benin, was to be involved in the exchange program with WVSC.

Senate Bill 653

WVSC Students and professors picket State Legislature

Students and faculty of West Virginia and Fairmont State Colleges dominated a Senate Finance Committee public hearing on a higher education reform bill which they feared would destroy their colleges, Senate Bill 653. Most controversial was the bill's provision to take community colleges away from most of the state's 4-year colleges to create independently accredited 2-year schools focusing on technical/job-training education.


A major point of contention was giving WVSC's Community College to Marshall University, which many felt was in an empire building contest with WVU. Additionally, WVSC's open admissions policy would have been revoked, ending the school's ability to accept marginal students and prepare them through remedial courses.

Finally, the Senate Finance Committee approved a compromise higher education bill that would delay controversial funding and community college recommendations for a year, putting on ice the plan to create a new Kanwha Valley Community College.









Gates Presents Resource Revolution

During West Virginia State College's Black History convocation, Henry Louis Gates, Jr., head of Harvard's Du Bois Institute for Afro-American Research, presented *Encarta Africana*, an encyclopedia of African and African-American history.

Taking up a goal set by W.E.B. Dubois, Gates worked for years on a comprehensive compilation of black history. In Cambridge, England, Gates vowed to finish the encyclopedia, aided by Swame Appiah and Wole Soyinka.

Gates followed his speech with a presentation of the multimedia encyclopedia and a promise that *Encyclopedia Africana* would keep African-American culture alive.

Fuller Family Dedicates Sculpture

Ravages of War Unveiled


The Solomon C. Fuller, Jr., family presented WVSC with a sculpture titled *Ravages of War* in October during Homecoming Week preceding the 3rd Annual Symposium of the WVSC National Center for Human Relations.

Casting of the sculpture completed by the late Meta Vaux Warrick Fuller was made possible by Bill Cosby. The foundry casting the bronze 17 x 14 x 20" statue required that a certain number of pieces be ordered. Cosby financed the bronzing and has one copy in his home. The second of the three belongs to a Maryland professor; the last is that donated to WVSC by the Fuller family.

According to a biographical sketch by Judith Kerr in 1986, the artist portrayed war symbolically as one of the Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse with an angel representing peace. Additionally, the artist had been influenced by mob violence against Black Americans. Fuller, who lectured at WVSC in the late 1950's, studied for three years in Paris with Auguste Rodin who pronounced her a born artist.

Meta Vaux Warrick Fuller was the first black woman to receive a government art commission. She was also honored by Howard University as one of three outstanding black artists: later, the NAACP presented her with a citation of merit.

The unveiling was performed by Mrs. Fuller's son, Solomon C. Fuller, Jr., along with his son, Dr. John L. Fuller, Sr., Director of Registration and Records at WVSC.



Chilton, Jr., a standout swimmer and diver at State, is a retired Kanawha County educator; Nellie Walker, originally employed in the Office of Registration and Records, later served as assistant women's basketball coach and as cheerleader sponsor; Russell Clark, a star baseball player for State in the late 1980's, earned All West Virginia Conference honors and left a .403 school record batting average and is currently affiliated with Smith Barney in Huntington; Alan Hamilton, who played football and basketball at State and served as basketball team captain from 1966-69, is employed by Hamilton County Health Dist.; the late Ernest Kent, who participated in football, basketball and track at State, was the first in his family to attend college; Dr. Taylor Perry, an All-WVC guard and linebacker in the 50's and an outstanding boxer, is currently the director of pupil services for Berkeley County Schools; and, Alfred Williams, who played football at State in the 60's and led the team in receiving, is a Detroit schoolteacher.

The induction ceremony took place as part of Homecoming Week festivities. Inductees were chosen by the National "W" Club, the athletic booster organization at State.

The ROTC Hall of Fame at West Virginia State College selected five graduates of the college's ROTC program for induction. Those selected had achieved distinction in military and civilian careers.








Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges 2000

Later State swept a double header from W. Liberty with Johnny Withrow blasting 3 homeruns.




Later, WVSC was eliminated from NCAA Division II North Atlantic regional play with a 4-3 loss to second-seeded team.



One-Man Cycling Team Kept on Rolling Along


Riding for State, Jacob Fetty placed first overall in an Atlantic Conference event hosted by North Carolina State in Raleigh. That performance also lifted the Yellow Jackets into a tie with William & Mary for first in the conference's Division II standings at the midway point of the season.

While schools such as Navy might bring 24 participants to a meet, Fetty was the lone racer for State. Fetty also placed first among Division II racers at events hosted by WakeForest and the University of Virginia.

The practice regimen employed by Fetty, a third-year pre-med student, obviously worked. He rode 18 to 24 hours weekly for training in addition to maintaining a full class load.

Fetty's performance in the college vents was remarkable considering the nature of cycling, which relies heavily on teamwork. "The dynamics of bicycle racing are such that teammates can help one another get up the road to win," Fetty explained. "Racing without a team forces me to expend large amounts of energy to make sure I'm in all the moves so that (State) can make it to the finish line."


